TIM HUNT • Wrote a letter to the Parks Board Commissioners	
Pickleball is a hugely popular and fast-growing sport; many players are seniors or almost-seniors, but it is growing in popularity among young people as well. We as a group are finding it increasingly difficult to find space to play; community centers are limited in court availability, and the infrequent sessions are therefore oversubscribed, so that one has to turn up at least 30 minutes before the start to even get a place. West Vancouver recently opened a wonderful dedicated pickleball facility at 29th and Bellevue. North Van has now followed suit, with the very recent opening of 6 courts at Murdo Fraser Park off Capilano road. We would like to see the City of Vancouver follow suit by designating an area for dedicated pickleball courts. We have access to some temporary ones at Queen Elizabeth park and also at the Dunbar Community Centre, but nothing that comes close to what West and North Vancouver have done. Would you be open to a meeting with the executive of the Vancouver Pickleball Association to discuss this project?

Thank you for the note. I looked at the outdoor courts they just opened in Red Deer, they're impressive. New dedicated pickleball facilities are popping up at a lot of places. I was able to connect with some of them to help us guide the process and in the meantime I found out that in a number of instances, it is the Pickleball Association building and operating the facility, not the City. We are taking all the necessary steps in the right direction and it is our hope and goal that we will have a pickleball facility in Vancouver as well.

Ask the city if money is an issue, if so, how much will the city contribute and how much can we fundraise?	
PERMANENT COURTS LOCATIONS 1. Strathcona – huge lot, but issues with being too close to houses 2. Pandora – 6 courts, but issues with sharing it with the basketball players 3. QE – 4 courts, best location but issues with needing to chase the ball. No fencing. 4. Marpole – ideal! They are in the planning stages of renovating the entire center. Encouraging everyone to fill out the survey to the Marpole planning committee to include outdoor pickleball courts
